- 2. Get away from( <u>बचना</u>) (phrasal verb) escape, elude/ dodge, get rid of. I needed to get away from the pressures of
- work.
  3. Account for (phrasal verb) to form the total of something: Students account for the vast majority of our customers. Existing and being to give a reason or explanation for (something)

- 4. **Hold off** (phrasal verb) hold back, delay/ to delay or postpone an action or decision Buyers have been holding **off** until the price falls
- 5. Bank on (phrasal verb) rely on, depend on, count on.

Can I <u>bank</u> on <u>your</u> <u>support</u>?

- 6. **Usher in** (phrasal verb) to start/begin, initiate/introduce. The <u>talks ushered</u> in a <u>new</u> era of <u>international</u> co<sup>-</sup>operation..
- 7. **Strike down** (phrasal verb) abolish, annul, nullify (a law regulation esp. an illegal one). *The <u>court</u> struck down the <u>law</u> on the <u>grounds</u> that it was <u>unconstitutional</u>.*
- 8. **Spring out/up** (phrasal verb) appear, develop, arise (suddenly). <u>उत्पन्न होना</u> *Thousands* of

new <u>businesses</u> have <u>sprung</u> **up** in the past <u>couple</u> of <u>years</u>

9. Drum up (phrasal verb) to try to increase business activity to get support for something Retailers

*are <u>trying</u> to <u>drum</u> up <u>sales</u> with <u>pricecuts</u>.. 10. Lay down (phrasal verb) - formulate, stipulate,* 

enact (a rule). <u>स्थापित करना</u> The <u>coach</u> laid down the <u>rules</u> from the first day of practice

11. **Take up** (phrasal verb) - accept agree, undertake. <u>शरू करना</u>

I'm not very good at <u>golf</u> – I only took it up <u>recently</u> 12. Set aside (phrasal verb) - overrule, overturn, cancel/dismiss. <u>परवा न करना</u> to decide not to consider something:

We need to **set aside** our differences and begin to cooperate

- 13. **Get around** (phrasal verb) To circumvent or evade: *managed to get around the rules.* 
  - 2.To deal with; overcome: *got around the proble m*.
  - **3.**To convince or win over by flattering or cajoli ng.
  - **4.**To travel from place to place: *It is hard to get around without a car.*
  - 5. To become known; circulate: *Word got aroun d.*
- 14. Chalk out (phrasal verb) plan, devise/conceive, formulate. रूपरेखा प्रस्तुत करना

We need to chalk out our financial planning

- 15. Get away with (phrasal verb) escape blame for, escape punishment to manage to do something bad without being punished or criticized for it. They have repeatedly broken the law and got away with it.
- 16. **Push through** (phrasal verb) succeed in passing a law accepted by the people who oppose it.

The president is trying to **push through** various tax reforms.

17. Hold out (phrasal verb) - continue, persevere, keep going.; <u>प्रतिरोध करना</u> resist or survive in difficult circumstances.

"British troops **held out against** constant attacks"

18. Hold back (phrasal verb) - desist, discontinue, refrain from doing something.; <u>रोक सकना</u> She kept trying to hold back her tears.

 19. Clear up (phrasal verb) - solve, resolve, answer.;
 ठीक करना (of an illness or bad weather) to go away, changing into a bettercondition:

If my <u>cold</u> doesn't clear up, it

will <u>ruin</u> my <u>vacation</u>.

Let's <u>hope</u> the <u>weather</u> clears up.

20. **Crank up** (phrasal verb) - increase, enlarge, raise.

The <u>kids</u> cranked up the <u>volume</u> on the <u>stereo</u>

If we don't crank up our efforts, we'llnever meet our goal for the fundraiser.

21. **Run into** (phrasal verb) - experience, encounter, meet with.

I ran **into** my boss at the supermarket. reach (a level or amount). "debts running into millions of dollars"

- 22. Lash out (phrasal verb) criticize, attack, censure verbally.I was only teasing him and suddenly he lashed out (at me) and hit me in the face.
- 23. **Walk back** (phrasal verb) reverse, change; retreat.

*He has since <u>walked</u> back his <u>opposition</u> to the <u>bill</u>.* 

- 24. Lie in (phrase verb) be present, exist. His skill lies in his ability to communicate quite complex ideas very simply.
- 25. **Double down** (phrasal verb) to be more firm & resolute on something (decided) even if that might be a risky choice. to continue to do something in an even more determined way than before;

to significantly increase or strengthen effort, in vestment, or resolve toward some goal, strategy , oraction so as to maximize the potential yield as a <u>result</u>

The president made clear that he intends to do uble downthe government's involvement in the war <u>overseas</u>

With the market booming, many companies are doubling downtheir development in mobile app s and games.

- 26. Back down (phrasal verb) withdraw, give in. If you back down, you withdraw a claim, demand, or commitment that you made earlier, because other people are strongly opposed to it. Local <u>residents</u> have <u>forced</u> the <u>local council</u> to backdown from/on <u>its plans</u> to <u>build</u> a <u>nightclub</u> on <u>their street</u>.
- 27. **Stand for** (phrasal verb) advocate, champion, uphold/support (an idea). *The party is trying to give the impression that it alone stands for democracy.*
- 28. Claw back (phrasal verb) a <u>situation</u> in whicha <u>government</u> or <u>company takes</u> back <u>mo</u> <u>ney</u> that it has already <u>paid</u>, retrieve, retake, reclaim., <u>वस्ती करना</u>

They will eventually be able to claw back all or most of the debt.

29. **Push back** (phrasal verb) - postpone, stall, delay.

How do we push back against <u>urban poverty</u> without <u>replacing</u> one <u>ne</u> <u>ed</u> with another need? a negative or unfavourable reaction or response. "we got some pushback on the new pricing"

- 30. **Throw open** (phrasal verb) make something accessible/attainable suddenly & fully.; खोल देना His withdrawal **threw open** the nomination to all comers
- 31. **Carve out** (phrasal verb) create, establish, take out (something with effort from a whole).; <u>कड़ी मेहनत से कमाना</u> to create or obtain something that helps you by skillful activities She **carved out** a reputation for herself as a high-powered lawyer

32. Strike out (phrasal verb) to <u>start</u> doing something new, <u>independently</u> of other <u>people</u> After <u>working</u> for her <u>father</u> for ten <u>years</u>, she <u>felt</u> it was <u>time</u> to <u>strike</u> out on her own be unsuccessful, fail.
"the company struck out the first time it tried

"the company struck out the first time it tried to manufacture personal computers"

  34. Bank on (phrasal verb) rely on confidently. ,

- 35. **Beat back** (phrasal verb) to force (someone) to go **back** or to retreat by fighting repel, fight off,

repulse/drive away.; मार भगाना

Our troops were beaten **back** by enemy forces

Throw up (phrasal verb) - produce something. The meeting threw up some interesting ideas.

**Come forward** (phrasal verb) - volunteer, step forward.

**Give up** (phrasal verb) - abandon, forgo, renounce.

Warm to (phrasal verb) - like, take to, become supportive of. warm up to sb to start to like someone

Ali immediately warmed to him

- Lie in (phrasal verb) be present, be contained, exist.
- Turn up (phrasal verb) arrive, attend, be present.;

If a <u>better situation</u> or an <u>opportunity</u> to do

something <u>turns</u> up,

it happens or becomes available unexpectedly o

r in a way that was not planned:

Don't worry about it - something will turn up, you'll <u>see</u>.

68. Rein in (phrasal verb) - restrict, control, restrain. <u>रोकना</u> to limit or control (someone or something)

His administration's economic policy would focus on reining in inflation.

Tone down (phrasal verb) - moderate, mitigate, modify/soften. People will be more likely to listen to you if

70. Sit down (phrasal verb) - accept/tolerate (tough situation).

150 countries sat down to discuss the impact of human activities on the atmosphere.

71. **Fall over** (phrasal verb) - crash, collapse, stop working.

I fell over the skates that you left on the stairs.

He dropped out of <u>school</u> when he was 16

- 75. Let down (phrasal verb) -fail to support, disappoint, abandon/neglect.
- 76. Dwell on (phrasal verb) to keep thinking or talking about something, especially something bad or unpleasant:
  In his speech, he dwelt on the plight of the sick and the hungry. linger over, think about, mull over.
- 77. **Catch up with** (phrasal verb) succeed in reaching a person who is ahead of one; to draw level with.

We left before them, but they soon **caught** us **up** again.

- 78. **Lag behind** (phrasal verb) trail, fall back, grow/develop slowly. 17.fall behind (phrasal verb) - default, be overdue, lag.
- 79. Stand up to (phrasal verb) defy, confront, challenge.; <u>डट कर सामना करना</u>

to defend yourself against a powerful person or organization when they treat you unfairly: He wasn't afraid to **stand up** to bullies.

- 80. Die down (phrasal verb) come to an end, drop/ stop, diminish. to gradually become less strong.
  ... She waited for the noise to die down before she started singing.
- 81. **Map out** (phrasal verb) outline, set out, detail.; to plan the details of (something, such as a program or one's future) We **mapped out** a plan

Flesh out (phrasal verb) - expand, add detail to, augment/refine.; अतिरिक्त ब्योरा जोडना

to add more detail when describing or explaining something: Emily should have included these pieces of information to **flesh out** her argument

83. **Step back** (phrasal verb) - withdraw, disengage, pull out/pull back.

84. **Harp on** (phrasal verb) - talk or write/complain continuously and lengthy on a particular subject.; <u>बडबडाना</u>

She kept harping on the fact that she had no household help at all.

- 85. **Crop up** (phrasal verb) happen, occur, arise.; <u>सामने आना</u> some urgent business had cropped up
- 86. **Come up** (phrasal verb) occur or present itself, especially unexpectedly when the opportunity came up again we didn't hesitate
- 87. **Cry out for** (phrasal verb) require, demand, need. *The <u>country</u> is <u>crying</u> out for a <u>change in leadership</u>.*
- 88. **Put out** (phrasal verb) publish, release, publicize/circulate. The French news agency put out a statement from the Trade Minister
- 89. **Cut into** (phrasal verb) obstruct, interrupt, interfere to <u>interrupt</u> an <u>activity</u> or <u>process</u>
- 90. Grapple with (phrasal verb) tackle, deal, struggle

91. **Leave aside** (phrasal verb) - neglect, ignore, snub/brush off.

- 105. **Set off** (phrasal verb) give rise to, cause/ invoke, begin/start.

- 106. Nut up (phrasal verb) provide, give, furnish.
- 107. **Drive down** (phrasal verb) force, impel press, (price/rate to go down).; to force a price, value, etc. to go **down**:

The company's primary concern was to increase competition and **drive down** prices.

108. **Draw up** (phrasal verb) - prepare, formulate, arrange; <u>रूपरेखा बनाना</u>

*I've <u>drawn</u> up a <u>list</u> of <u>candidates</u> that <i>I'd like* to <u>interview</u>..

109. **Pop up** (phrasal verb) - appear abruptly, occur suddenly, arrive.

She's one of

those <u>movie stars</u> who <u>pops</u> up <u>everywhere</u>, on TV, in <u>magazines</u>, on Broadway.

110. **Keep up with** (phrasal verb) - match, equal, compete/vie with.

Wages are failing to keep up with inflation

- 111. Lie ahead (phrasal verb) be going to happen. "I'm excited by what lies ahead"
- 112. Boil over (phrasal verb) reaching the point at which a condition becomes more serious (due to angry) & it cannot be controlled.Union members' frustrations boiled over in demonstrations this weekend.
- 113. Claw back (phrasal verb) retrieve, retake, reclaim.
- 114. **Call or** (phrasal verb) demand, ask, request. to ask someone to do something: She **called** on <u>Americans to be more tolerant of each other</u>.
- 115. **Come up with** (phrasal verb) produce, devise, propose.
  - She's come up with

some <u>amazing scheme</u> to <u>double</u> her <u>income</u>

- 116. Crash out (phrasal verb) eliminate.
- 117. **Rule out** (phrasal verb) exclude, eliminate, reject. ; ख़ारिज कर देना exclude, eliminate. 2 : to make impossible : prevent Heavy rain **ruled out** the picnic.
- 118. Mop up (phrasal verb) बुरी तरह से पछाड़ देना to <u>finish</u> the last <u>part</u> of a job after most of it has been <u>completed</u> The <u>battle</u> had been <u>won</u>,

but two <u>infantry units</u> were <u>left</u> behind to mop up.

- 119. **Cast away** (phrasal verb) discard/reject, abandon, leave behind.
- 120. **Come under** (phrasal verb) be subjected to.
- 121. **Call off** (phrasal verb) cancel, abandon, shelve/drop.
- 122. Fold up (phrasal verb) fail, collapse/crumble, give up.
- small businesses were *folding up* right and left 123. **Turn away** (phrasal verb) - refuse admittance to, send away, reject/rebuff/repel.
- 124. Shore up (phrasal verb) bolster up, support, buttress/strengthen.: मजब्त करना The tax cuts are supposed to *shore up* the economy.
- 125. Play down (phrasal verb) <u>कम करके दिखाना</u> under-emphasize, downplay, understate; to make something seem less important or less bad than it really is: Military spokespeople tried to **play down** the

seriousness of the disaster.

- 126. **pop up** (phrasal verb) appear abruptly, occur suddenly, arrive.
- 127. Set on (phrasal verb) strike, attack, hit.
- 128. Account for (phrasal verb) constitute, make up, comprise/form.
- 129. **Contend with** (phrase verb) cope with, face, grapple/deal with.
- 130. Factor in (phrasal verb) included/added as a factor/point when making a decision.People are earning more, but when inflation is factored in, they are no better off.
